KINDERGARTEN CENTER

A student's participation in school wide activities helps hone communication skills, foster creative thinking, and improve leadership ability. While there are currently no clubs at the Kindergarten Center, our youngest students are invited to participate in the following activities.



Hudson Falls Fire Department Visits

Aimed at teaching fire safety to our youngest students, the Hudson Falls Fire Department visits the Kindergarten Center each October for Fire Safety Month. Then, in June, students take a field trip to visit the Hudson Falls Fire Department. Attendees will take a tour of the fire station and participate in a fire safety education program. This is open to kindergarten students only.

Halloween Parades

To celebrate Halloween, students are invited to participate in their respective grades' Halloween Parade. The UPK classes hold a walk to the Strand Theater on Halloween, and the kindergarten classes have their separate parade later in the day.

Snow Plow Safety

In November, the Kindergarten Center arranges a snow plow visit to the school. The driver teaches the students about the importance of snow removal and how to be safe during the winter season. This is open to UPK and kindergarten students.

PTSA Craft Night

The Parent Teacher Student Association hosts a Craft Night for students at our Kindergarten Center. Through arts and crafts, students have a space to express their creativity and imagination while learning to take pride in their work. PTSA Craft Night is open to UPK and kindergarten students.

Class Carnival

In June, our UPK classes set up a carnival on campus. UPK Students are invited to play games, win prizes, and participate in activities centered around the theme of the carnival. On the same day, our kindergarten classes will be treated to a field trip.

Field Trip to Hudson Falls Police Station

The Kindergarten Center hosts an annual field trip in June to the local police station. Students are invited to tour the station, learn about the duties of a police officer, and see the holding cells, fingerprint machines, camera equipment, patrol vehicles, and more. This activity is only open to kindergarten students.

Field Trip to Hudson Falls Public Library

Once a month, our kindergarten students take a walking trip to the Hudson Falls Public Library where they are treated to story time by one of the staff members. These outings are a wonderful opportunity to connect our students to all that our village library has to offer both during and after the school day.

STEAM Days

Twice a year, our National Honor Society students volunteer to spend a day with our UPK and kindergarten students at a variety of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) stations. From programming and coding a mouse to making their very own snow, these activities introduce students to the world of science, technology, engineering and mathematics.



Ag Club

(Fourth/Fifth Grade Only)





Quest Club


